Anna Lou is resting in the arms of Jesus after a short illness. She was born in Ordway, Colorado on September 21, 1923 to George A. Walker and B. Frances Case. Anna Lou had a cultural background. She loved to harmonize, play the piano; read the classics, nonfiction, history and biographies. Ms. Walker loved to dress in her finest for parties. She enjoyed writing poetry and listening to jazz music. A friend described her as having a heart of gold. She looked to the future with gratitude. Her appetite rule was to eat dessert first! Acrobatics, no-hand somersaults and cartwheels were her specialty for being a Yell leader. She was voted most popular girl in her class and graduated from Centennial High School in 1941. Anna Lou was a riveter on the B-17, B-19 and B-42 wing spar in the jig shop of the Boeing Plant in Seattle, Washington. To save her hearing, she transferred to the Accounting Department at Boeing. Anna Lou married Bernard A. Eisert on January 25, 1944. They raised four children, Kathleen (Ron) Lautaret, John, who is deceased (Marty) Eisert, Daniel Eisert and Mary Kay Oliva. Anna Lou studied secretarial courses at Southern Colorado State College (now Colorado State University). While working in Denver at the Federal Fish and Wildlife, she met "Bill", who was the 'love of her life'. In 1990 Anna Lou moved to Boulder, Colorado. Grandkids remember her sense of humor, exploring hiking trails, having tea parties and going to the Denver museum of Natural History. Anna Lou is survived by her sister, Georgena Coover of Williamsville, New York; three of her children; nine grandchildren and fifteen great-grandchildren. Her son John and friend, Bill

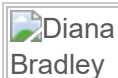
