He enjoyed working on their property, taking care of the horses and cows and spending time with Vir and his friends in Avondale. He and Virginia's focus the past 8 years was taking care of their son, Nathan, in their home after a traumatic car accident but traveled to Pennsylvania as much as they could to spend time with their daughter's family. Even though the distance was far, it didn't interfere with the closeness his grandchildren felt to "Grampo" as his subtle actions showed his love and devotion. As Vir would
