She was up at 4:00 am each morning so she could arrive at the restaurants and get ready for the day's business. Earleen was well known for the homemade breads and pies she made at each restaurant. She retired from Dana's in 2019 at age 92. Earleen kept herself busy with her garden in the front and back yard. Most every day from Spring to Fall, you could find her out weeding or watering her garden. Earleen became an obsessed fan of the Colorado Rockies, planning her events for the day around their schedule. She had her own scoring sheet for each game and wrote a personal note to each player throughout the season. Even when she attended her youngest brother's funeral in Kansas, she planned her road trip around the Rockies' game. Earleen and Dennis stayed in a motel along the way so she wouldn't miss their game that day. Earleen touched so many people throughout her lifetime. We were all blessed by knowing her as a mother, grandmother, great
