“ To the family of Eddie Vigil

I first met Eddie in 1975 when Kathy and I moved back to Pueblo from Michigan with the idea of eventually taking over Perma-Cast Company, the company my father started in 1957. I was 26 at the time, Eddie was 33. From the beginning Eddie let me know that I was at the bottom of the pecking order at Perma-Cast. It took a few years for our relationship to evolve from where it was to a place of real friendship.

Kathy and I have always looked at Eddie as a friend. Eddie above all was honest. If he told you anything you could take it as fact. He was a loyal employee, always doing his best. He had a great work ethic. Give him a job and he would complete it. He had the most difficult job at Perma-Cast as an aluminum molder. During the summer the job was really a tough one, especially when we were located on West Street. The heat in that building was really unbearable for 3 months out of the year. Over the years our working conditions improved a great deal but when Eddie reached retirement age he retired. I tried to talk him into working part time. My feeling was that the social interaction at work would be good for him. Eddie wanted no part of part time work. He wanted to be carefree and he was.

Family was the most important thing to Eddie. He and Linda made a wonderful pair. She kept Eddie on the straight and narrow and he was the provider for the family. Eddie never really knew that Linda was the real boss. He loved Linda. Eddie was a devoted husband a great father who instilled those good family values in his children. Every day Eddie would engage you in conversation when he came to work. The conversation was never about Eddie it was always about someone in the family. He talked about Linda and all of the children. When the youngest child, Crystal, came along Eddie was perplexed. He told me one day, that girl just won't listen to her father. I told Eddie that maybe it was because her father was full of crap. Eddie just laughed. I think Crystal was 11 or 12 at the time. It was so sad for the family to lose Linda at such a young age. Cancer is a terrible disease. I know Eddie has missed her so since she

*departed this life. Linda was loved and missed by all who knew her. Our hearts go out to the Vigil Family with the passing of their father. Eddie was a stern father but mostly he was a loving father. I am sure he and Linda look down on us now with great pride in the family they started so many years ago.
