He always said he was blessed to come Pueblo from clear across the world and find all the things that he loved and were the best things in life. He was very happy to have found Praise Church. He loved to listen and learn from our wonderful pastors and to meet many people whom he considered friends. He always felt that he was blessed to meet a man whom he equaled to Billy Graham, his Pastor, Mentor and Friend, Reverend Bobby Wilson.
