After retirement his most important job the lord gave him to do was to be caretaker for his Mother Viola who has Parkinson's disease, His Brother Joe with Multiple Sclerosis and in a wheel chair, and his Wife Sandy who has multiple

Sclerosis, you were our everything Lawrence, you were always your Dads Concentitho, and you are in heaven with him and your brothers rest in Peace. Went to Risley, and Graduated from Centennial High School in 1972. He ran the Pikes Peak Marathon twice. Lettered in track numerous times, under coach Pickering. These were probably the biggest accomplishments of my life he would say but that wasn't true Lawrence, You were a proud man, and we were your biggest accomplishments, You were loved so much. Preceded in death by Baby brother Joe, Father Agapito Duran, Brother Raymond Duran, Grandparents Joe and Flora Sanchez Mother -in-law, and father -in-law, George and Viola Angel, brother-in-laws, Jack, Gerald, Dave, and Angel; sister-in-law, Rose Garcia.
