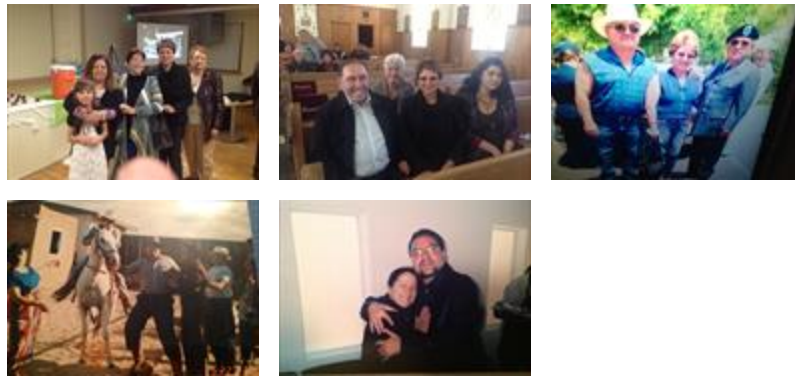
Golf traveling trips are no more. She loved line-dancing or dancing with John at the Eagles. I will miss Silvia a lot, she and I were good friends.
