time and distance. His many friends and family were very important to him. Tom loved traveling. He traveled to many countries over the years including Italy, France, Germany, Spain and Mexico. Tom was an outdoors man. He loved hiking, camping and mountain climbing. Tom liked dancing, music (especially oldies), reading his daily devotionals and learning about health and wellness, he also authored a book. Tom really loved baseball. He continued to play after retirement, primarily as a pitcher. We will think of him whenever we watch baseball.
